- remove waste materials	muscle strain	.....	.....
- relocate horse to be parallel on opposite side of stall	trampling	.....	.....
- sprinkle stable lime as directed	inhalation, skin or eye contact	.....	.....

- Evaluate:

- Risk is a function of both consequence and likelihood. Accordingly, the above ratings should be added together to calculate a total risk rating;
- The following nominal bands are prepared as a guide:
  - 24 – 48 Very high risk
  - 49 – 72 High risk
  - 73 – 96 Medium risk
  - 97 – 120 Low risk

- Treatment:

- Controls should be adopted to minimise risk. These include:
  - Key safety plant/personal protective equipment (“ppe”):
    - gloves, safety boots, dust mask;
    - head collar/lead/twine (for tying);
    - rake, fork, shovel, manure scoop, lime, dung bag or bin.
  - Safety checks/hazardous substances:
    - tools in sound working condition;
    - dust mask for those suffering from allergies or asthma;
    - ppe for those handling lime.

- External considerations:
  - satisfactory airflow, lighting.
  
- Qualifications/experience/training required to complete work:
  - registered stablehand with horse handling competency and requisite training.
