## • Evaluate:

- Risk is a function of both consequence and likelihood. Accordingly, the above ratings should be added together to calculate a total risk rating;
- The following nominal bands are prepared as a guide:
  - 20 40 Very high risk
  - 41 60 High risk
  - 61 80 Medium risk
  - 81 100 Low risk

## Treatment:

- o Controls should be adopted to minimise risk. These include:
  - Key safety plant/personal protective equipment ("ppe"):
    - safety work boots and gloves;
    - wide-brimmed hats/sunscreen;
    - bridles/head collars/leads/anti-rearing bits;
    - non-slip parade surface;
    - barricades and signage directing visitors to designated area.

- Safety checks/hazardous substances:
  - guard dog(s) secured;
  - vet products and assorted equipment in locked cabinets;
  - stable tools stored away and secured;
  - check all bridles and leads in good condition.
- External considerations:
  - weather conditions.
- Qualifications/experience/training required to complete work:
  - licensed trainer and registered personnel;
  - horse handling competency, people skills.

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
